We appreciate all the prayers that have been made on our behalf for both the loss of our unborn baby and our travels. Though we are still grieving and trying to understand God's plan, we are doing our best to trust Him and continue our path toward Uganda. Currently, Uganda's covid restrictions make it very difficult to enter the country or do any ministry work. We barely made it out of the country at the end of our survey trip, and the restrictions have increased even more since we left. For many reasons, a set time for our departure to Uganda is unknown at this time. Please pray with us that God would make His timing and plan clear during the next few months. In the meantime, we will be able to stay with family and serve in Abbey's home church since we still cannot visit our sending church in Canada.

These are some specific prayer requests we currently have:

- 1. Abbey's health and recovery. Please continue to pray for Abbey to recover from the miscarriage.
- **2. Uganda to open again.** As mentioned above, covid restrictions have tighten again. Please pray that the number of cases would decrease and that the president would lift the lockdown.
- **3.** The US/Canada border to open. July 4<sup>th</sup> will be the first Sunday without any restrictions for Canadian churches! We praise the Lord for this first step in reopening Canada, but please continue to pray that the border would open soon.
- **4. More Christians to surrender to missions.** Jeremiah wrote in Lamentations, "Mine eye affecteth mine heart..." If Christians would look and see, we would realize the great need that the people around the world have.
