The Next Step Youth Class continued to grow with new visitors attending, and we now have a faithful group of twenty-five to thirty young adult members in whom we can invest our time. Last week, I started a discipleship program with one of our members named Kato. Please pray that he continues to grow in the Lord. Also, this month, we were asked to teach a music class at the East Africa Baptist College. The fifteen-week course began last Thursday, and Abbey and I are both excited to have the opportunity to transfer information we learned in Bible college. Lastly, our Rutooro language studies have begun, and we are making progress. So far, we have learned the alphabet, numbers, nouns, greetings, days, months, and time. Please pray that we will continue to understand and be able to memorize the language.

Carson is doing well in his nursery school. He has made many friends and learned several songs which he sings at home regularly. Each day, he comes home having learned new letters, numbers, and stories. He truly enjoys spending time with the children, and the teachers are delighted that we have chosen to place him in a national school.

Early last week, our language teacher, Ms. Lois, asked us what religion we practiced. We had been praying that God would open a door for us to witness to her, and this was clearly an opening. We told her that we would like to take her through a discipleship program to help her understand the things of God better. The plan was that she would come to our home after language training on Mondays. However, on Saturday, Carson developed a painful case of pink eye, and we had to keep him home from school. Because of this, we asked Ms. Lois if she would feel comfortable coming to our home to do a Rutooro lesson and begin the discipleship program. She arrived at 10am, and at 12:30pm she tearfully accepted Christ as her Saviour! Her salvation was special to us because she is our first Tooro convert. What a joy it has been to see God's hand working! She is teaching us Rutooro, and we are teaching her the Bible. Please pray that God would give us wisdom as we continue to disciple her and encourage her in the Lord.
