Just as many Ugandans, he had been tricked into thinking his church attendance, offerings, and infant baptism were enough to earn his way to Heaven. Most who believe these lies simply need someone to show them what the Bible says, and they will quickly and eagerly accept Christ. This was the case with Kevin. In less than an hour of an explanation, he accepted Christ as his personal Savior. His salvation is another answer to our original prayer regarding a language instructor. It has been truly amazing to see the life of Lois transformed by Christ. She has almost completed the discipleship program, has had her first convert accept Christ, and is continuing to witness to her family and friends. Please pray for the spiritual growth of Lois and Kevin and for the ability to build more relationships with Ugandans.

Also, in the month of May, we had the awesome privilege to experience our first major cultural event. We attended the "Introduction of Pastor Elly," which is the first time the groom meets his future

wife's family. This usually takes place ONE WEEK before the wedding. The introduction was an all-day

experience that included nearly nine hours of driving, much sitting, and a lot of eating! For the occasion, we wore the cultural clothing for the Buganda tribe's special events: gomesi for the ladies and the kanzu for the men. The

One week later, we were able to help coordinate their traditional church wedding back in Kampala. Please pray for this young couple as they begin their lives together serving in the ministry.

Although we will be attending the current ministry where we serve until Father's Day, we will begin attending Faith Baptist Church of Namugongo at the end of the June. This will give us another opportunity to see how a ministry can function in a large city of Uganda. We would ask for your prayers during this time of transition.
